

Small amounts of pharmaceuticals - including antibiotics, hormones, mood stabilizers and other drugs - are finding their way in our drinking water supply every day as people dump their used medications down the drain. A few small steps can make an important difference to help safeguard lives and protect the environment.

- *Donate medications to the Wyoming Department of Health's Medication Donation Program, which redistributes medicines to qualified residents who have low incomes, are without insurance or are underinsured. Call (855) 257-5041 to see what medications and medical items can be accepted, or visit www.wyomedicationdonation.org.
- *Take advantage of community pharmaceutical and law enforcement take-back programs or solid waste programs. Call your city or county government's law enforcement or household trash and recycling service (see blue pages in phone book) to see if a take-back program is available in your community.
- *Mix prescription drugs with an undesirable substance, such as used coffee grounds or kitty litter, and put them in impermeable, non-descript containers, such as empty cans or sealable plastic bags, and dispose.
